#### THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

## First Lesson: A Reading from the Book of Acts (1:15-17, 21-26)

In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred twenty persons) and said, "Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus - for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry. So one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us - one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection." So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed and said, "Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place." And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles.

## **BACKGROUND INFORMATION FROM DR. WALTER DELLER ON THE PSALM**

Psalm 1

The Psalter opens with a psalm that likely comes from the wisdom traditions of ancient Israel. We find some of the same imagery and language in Jeremiah 17:5-8. The psalm opens with the term 'ashre, which can mean happy, or rich, or blessed. It is likely the Hebrew equivalent of the Aramiac word Jesus used to begin each of the beatitudes (Matthew 5). Some characterize psalm 1 as the psalm of the "two ways." Our choices can lead us more and more deeply into bad company and actions that destroy others and the web of society (verse 1), or they can lead us into lives of growth and fruitfulness guided by attention to God's teaching (vv. 2-4). The psalm suggests that to make the choice for the evil pathway will lead eventually to the judgement of the community on one's actions. But it also suggests that those who choose that path will find themselves on a road that leads ultimately to destruction (vv. 4-5, 6b). Those who choose to live their lives with God will discover that God chooses to live with them and watch over them (v. 6a).
